

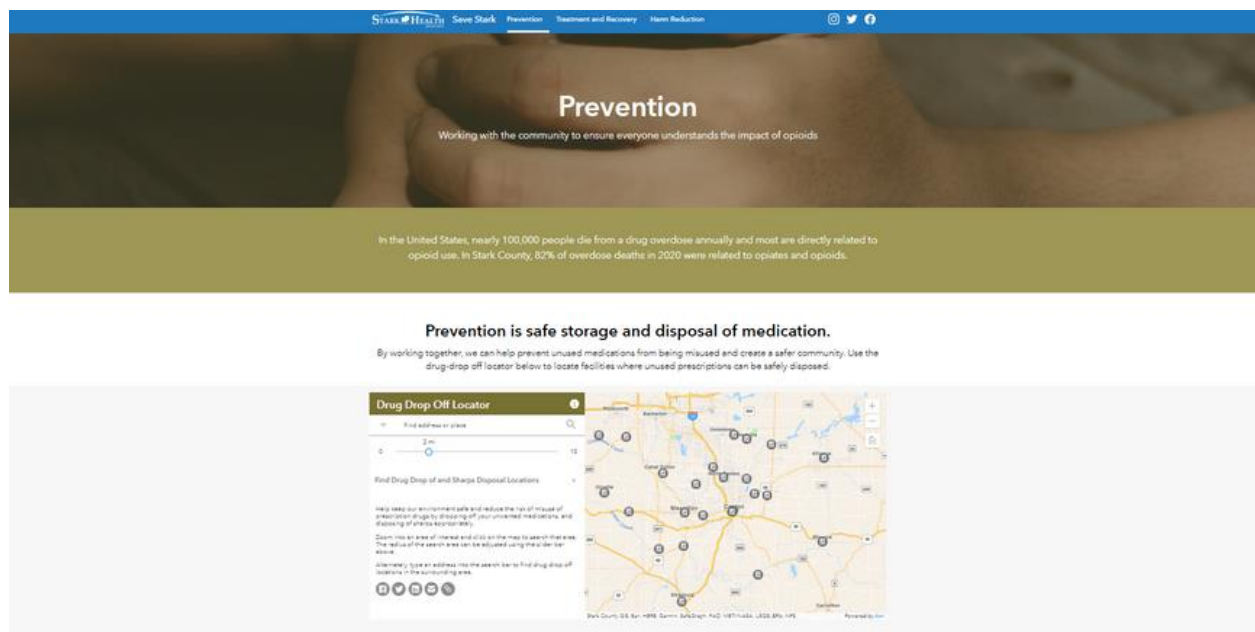
How to navigate a resource locator on a SCHD program Hub site.

Resource locators, as used by the Stark County Health Department (SCHD), are location centric apps that help users find tailored services, providers, organizations, agencies, etc. found within a certain radius of an entered address. Users search for an address or location on the map and the locator shows all the available resources close to that address. The locator also includes information about each resource, such as address, phone number, website, and hours. This document outlines how to best use these locators to search for information quickly and efficiently.

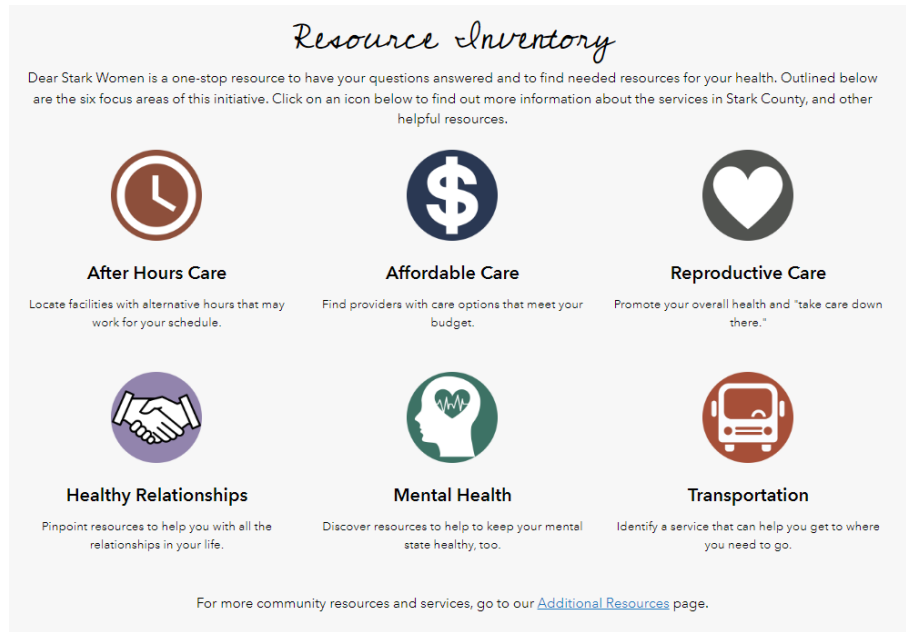
1. Find a locator.

The first step to using one of the resource locators is to find one. Some are embedded on the SCHD website program pages while each of the SCHD program sites built with ArcGIS Hub have multiple locators. These program sites are the COVID-19 Business Safety Initiative, Save Stark: Overdose Prevention Resource Platform, Dear Stark Women, and Stark Marketeers.

Each locator has resources tailored to a specific topic corresponding to the pages on the sites to streamline your search process. The services you are looking for will determine which locator you should use to find the resources you need.



Prevention page on Save Stark site showing the Drug Drop-off Locator.

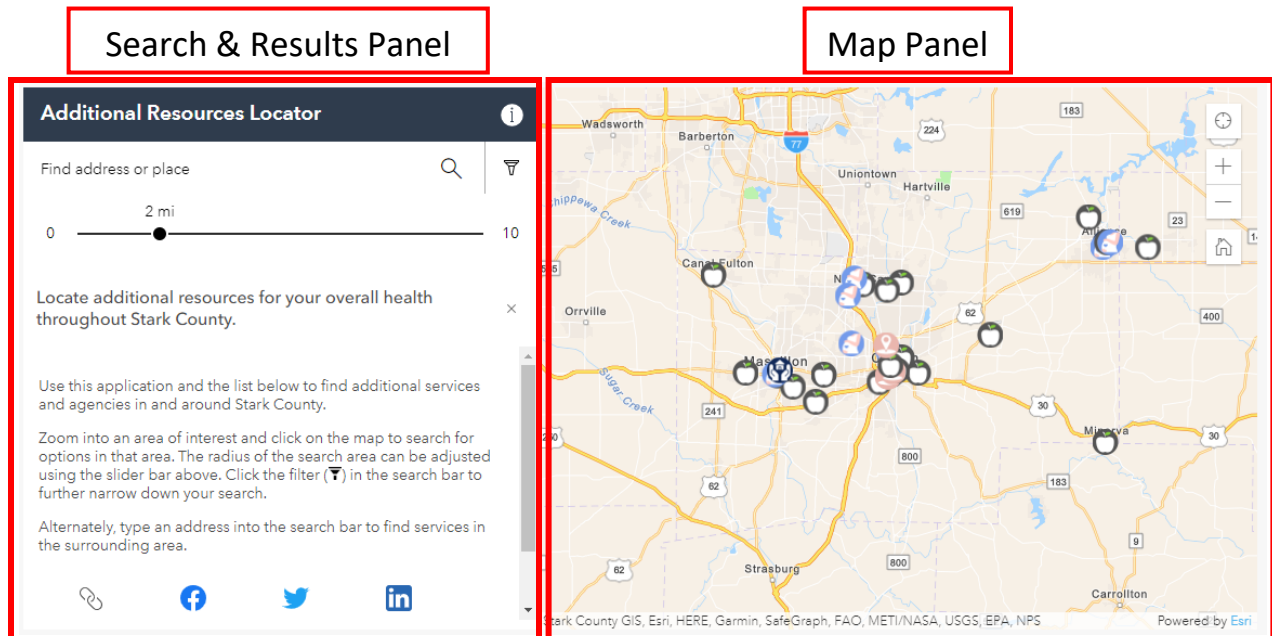


Resource Inventory for Dear Stark Women. Each icon links to a locator with resources about the specific focus area.

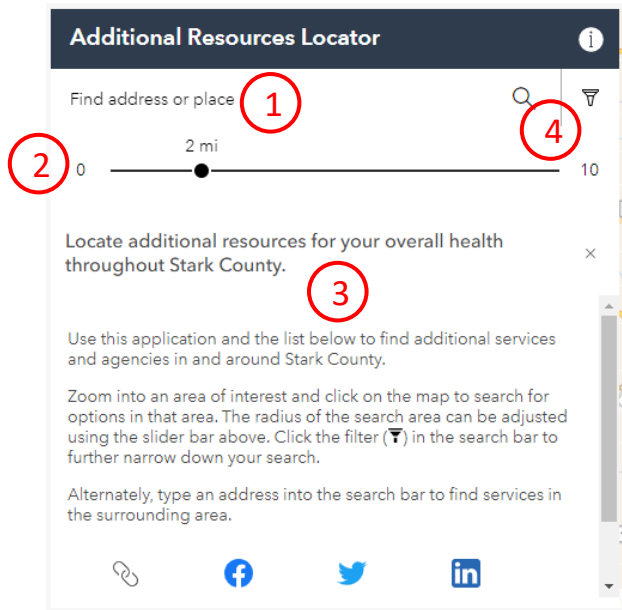
2. Get familiar with the locator.

Once you have found a locator with the resources you are looking for, now you can familiarize yourself on all the parts of the locator. We will use the Additional Resources Locator from the Dear Stark Women site as an example.

Each locator has two main panels: the Search & Results Panel and the Map Panel.



- The Search & Results Panel is along the left side of the locator. This is where you will input the address to search for and interact with the resulting resource list.



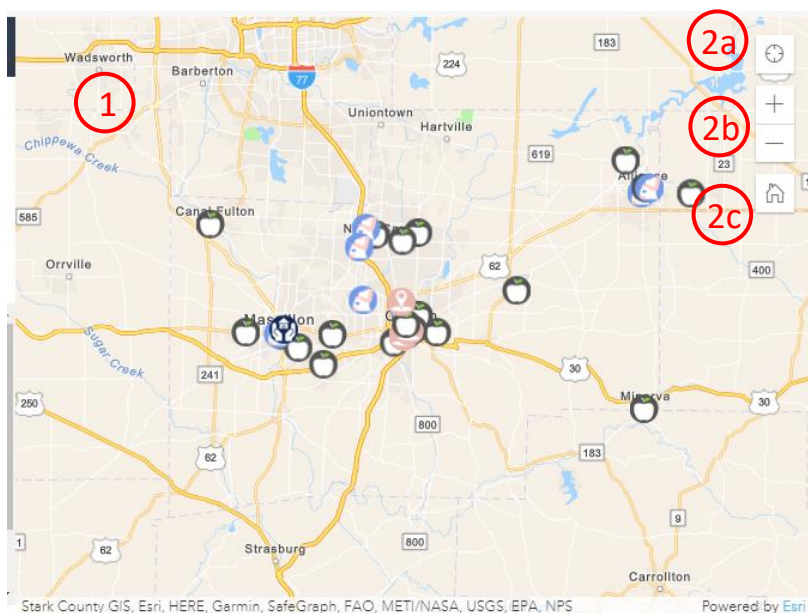
1. The search bar is located at the top of the panel, underneath the locator title. The bar is labeled, “Find address or place” (and a magnifying glass symbol).

2. Below the search bar is the search radius slider. This slider lets you adjust the size of the search radius around your entered address. The search radius is set to a default of 2 miles.

3. Next is the locator instructions. This section will have text outlining what kind of resources are in the locator and a short description on how to search for resources. You can also share the locator on social

media with the links at the end of the section. When you do enter an address, the results from the search are listed here as well. See the “Navigate the results” section below for more details.

4. Some of the locators also have a filter option for you to narrow down the resources in the locator. See the “Search for a location” section below for more details on the filter.
- The Map Panel is the remaining right side of the locator. This is where you can see the locations of the resources, the location of your entered address, and the search radius.



1. The Map Panel will initially show the Stark County area and all resources in the locator at the default extent.

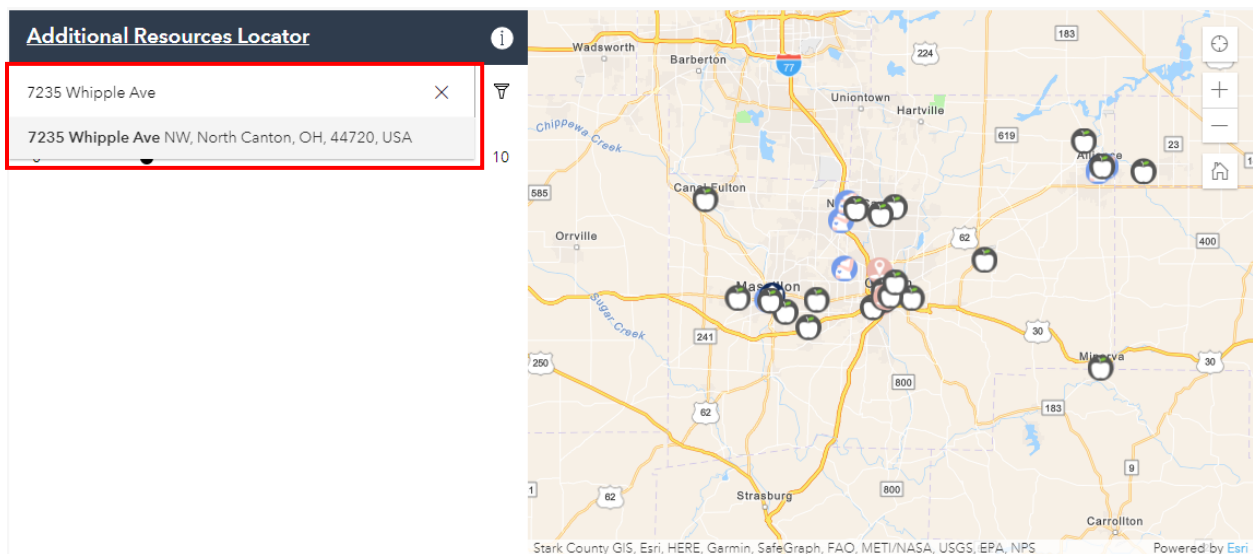
2. You can navigate around the map using the buttons in the upper right corner of the map.

- a. Find current location – if you have location enabled on your device, use this button see your current location.

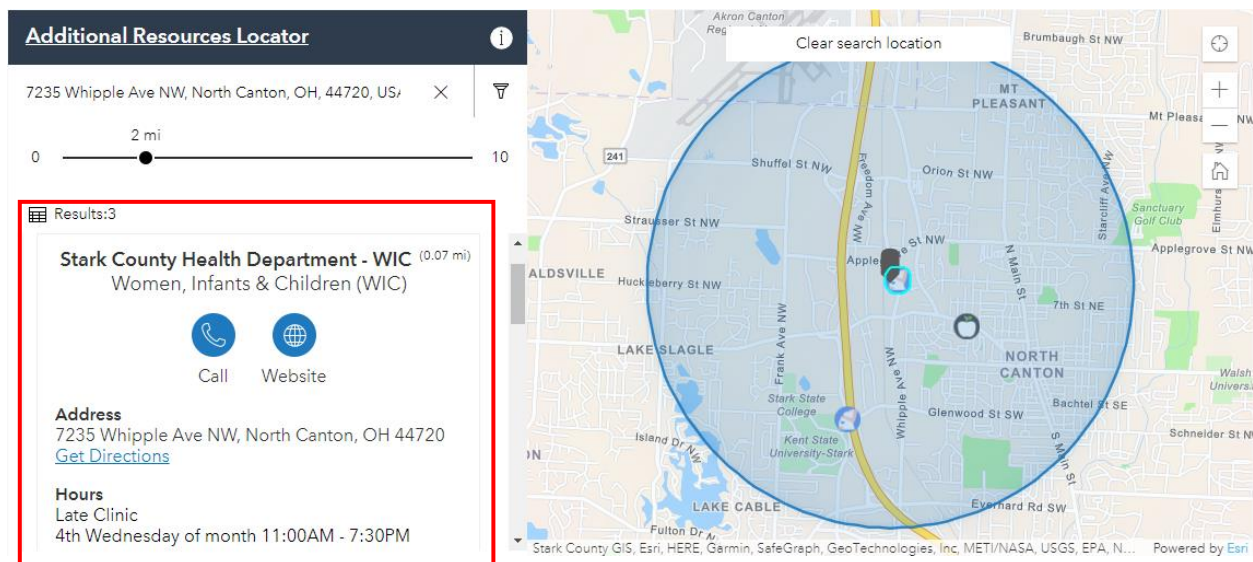
- b. Zoom in and out – use these to zoom in (closer to the ground) or out (farther from the ground) of the current map extent.
 - c. Home button – use this button to return to the default map extent.
 - d. You can also pan around the map with your mouse or finger by clicking/pressing and dragging in any direction.
3. Once you make a search, the map will automatically zoom to the search area. Continue to the next section below for more information.

3. Search for a location.

Now that you have found a locator and know how to navigate it, you can start to search for resources. The first step is to enter an address into the search bar. As you are typing, suggestions will appear below the search bar. Click on one of the suggestions to complete the search or continue typing and hit enter.

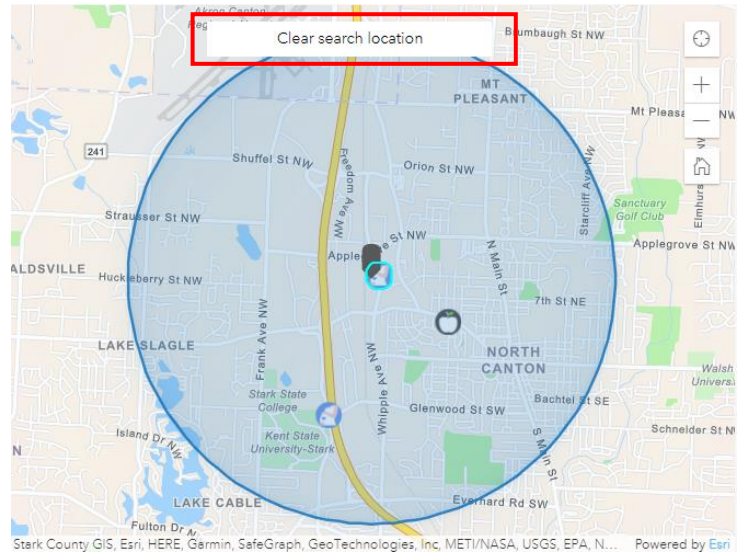


The map will zoom to the address entered and show all the resources within the set search radius. Information cards with details about all those resources will appear in the Search & Results Panel.



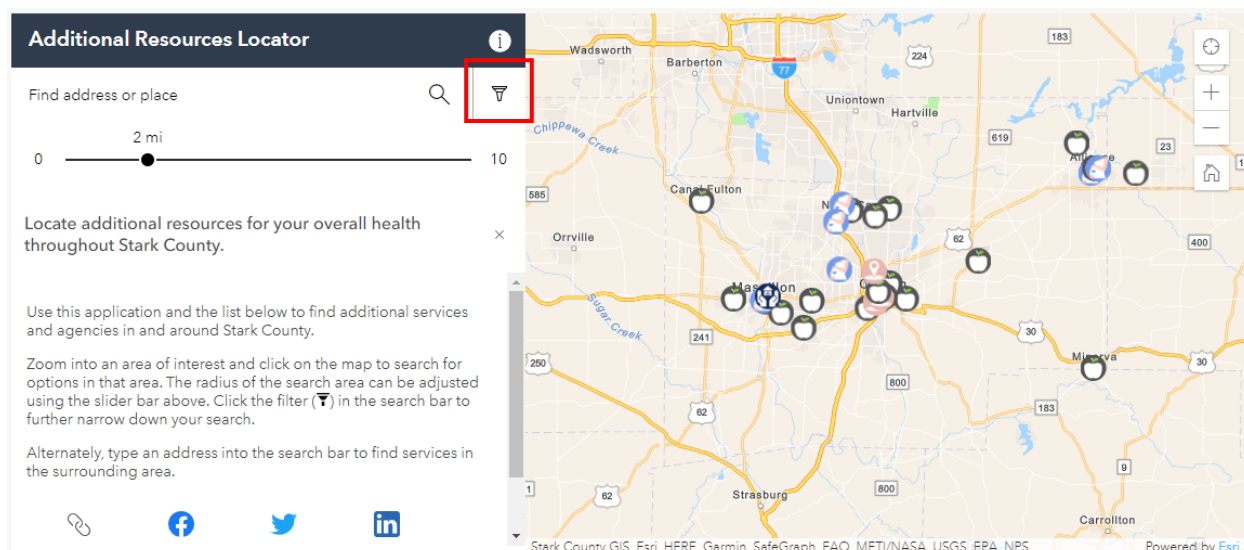
Another way to search for a location is to click directly on the map. This is helpful if you do not know an exact address to search for, but know the general area you would like to search. Simply navigate in the map panel to the area you want, click on the map, and just as before the map will zoom to where you clicked and show all the resources within the set search radius.

If you want to start another search, click the “Clear search location” button at the top of the map panel (or the “x” on the right side of the search bar).

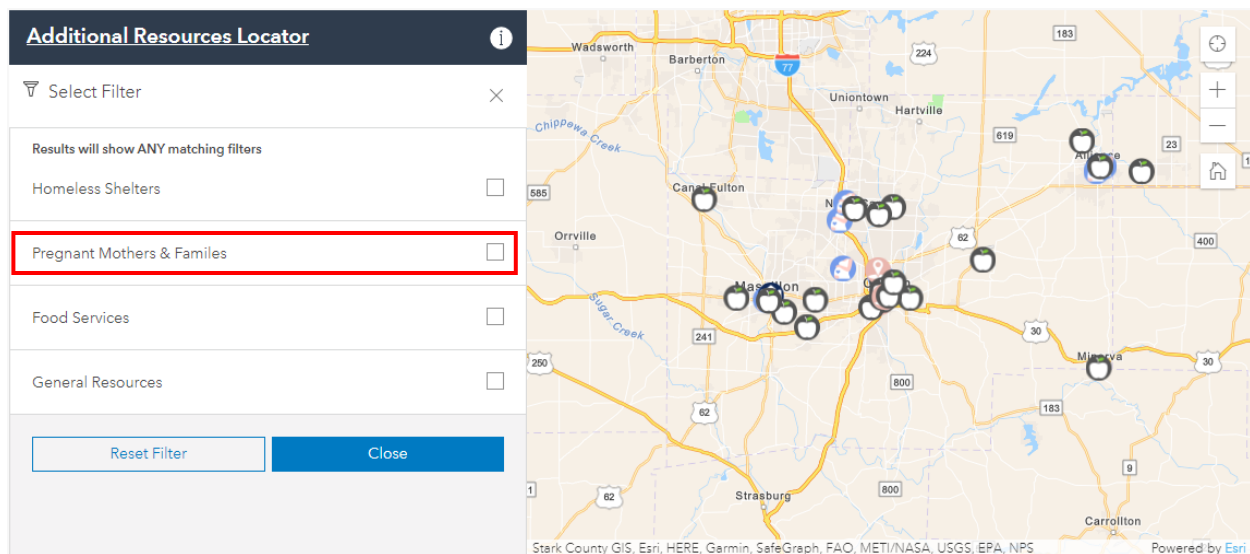


Filters

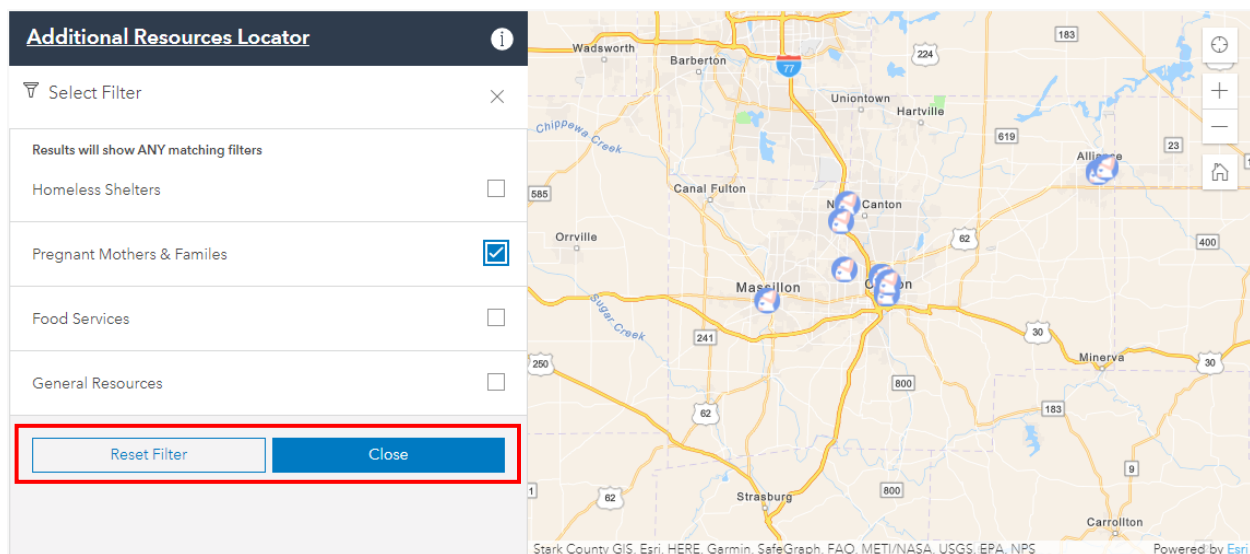
As mentioned in Section 2, some of the locators have filters for you to narrow down your search. Click the filter symbol on the right side of the search bar to see the filter list.



Each filter option in the list is labeled as to what it will do. In the Dear Stark Women Additional Resources Locator, the filters will narrow down the type of resource you can search for. For example, if you want to look for resources tailored to Pregnant Mothers & Families, select the check box next to the label.



The map will automatically update to show only the resources based on the new filter choice. To exit the filter list and continue searching/return to the results, select “Close.” To clear all the filters and search for all the resources again, select, “Reset Filter.”



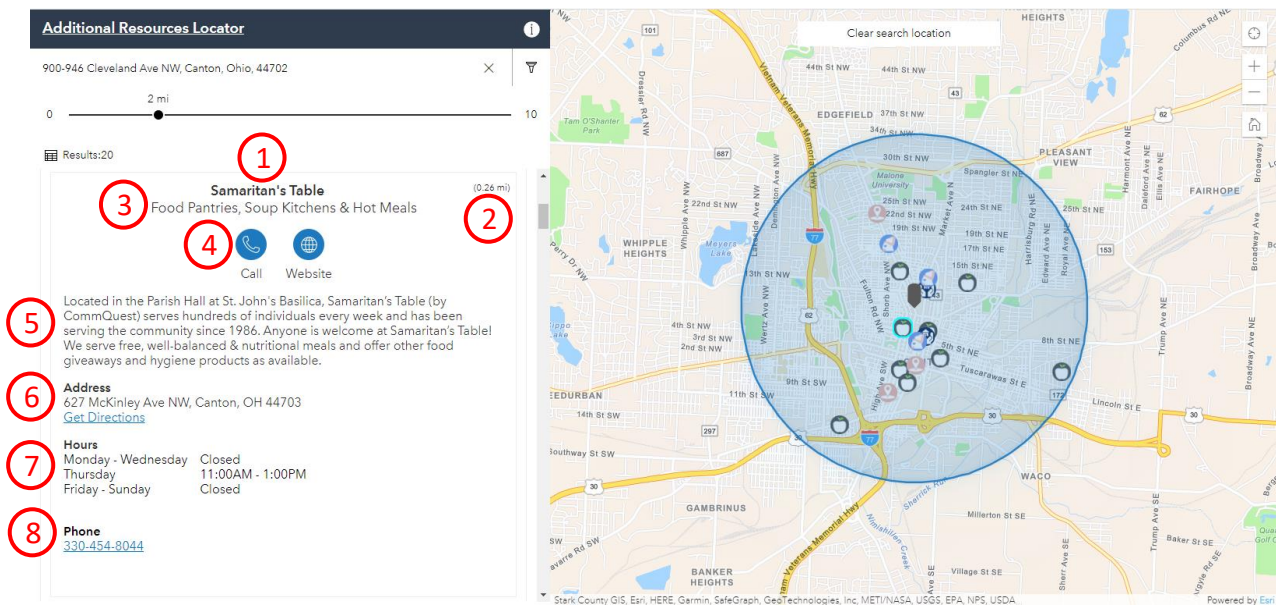
Filter lists will be set to filter resources one of two ways:

- If the filter list has, “Results will show ANY matching filters,” the resources with at least one of those characteristics will show on the map.
- If the filter list has, “Results will show ALL matching filters,” only the resources that have all of those characteristics will show on the map.

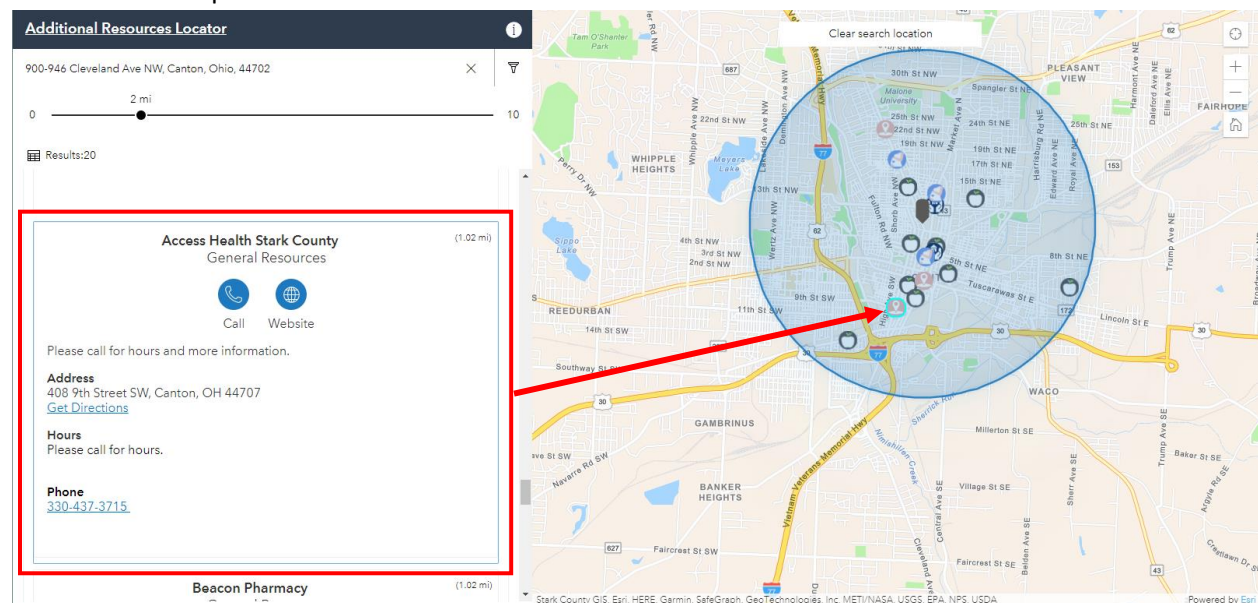
4. Navigate the results.

The results of your search appear as a list, in order of closest to farthest away, in the Search & Results Panel. Each resource has an information card, which shows the details of the organization or service.

1. Title/Name of resource
2. Distance from entered location (in miles)
3. Type of resource
4. Call and Website buttons – these are links to make a direct call or access their website
5. Description/Comments
6. Address and Directions – the link will open a Google Maps page with the address entered
7. Hours
8. Phone number



As you scroll through the resources, the corresponding icon will highlight on the map (outlined in blue). You can also click on a resource information card and the map will pan so that the resource is in the center of the map.



5. Final Notes

Outlined above is the process for how to use all of the resource locators provided by the Stark County Health Department. We hope that you feel confident in how to search for and find the resources you need in Stark County.
