Going to continue to align strategies with the SC CHA- staying connected with Kay and Kelly. Getting the assessment done and then coming back to work together for CHIP. Looking at hyperlocal communities, right around the hospital. Aultman: Still trying to decide process/vendor (squire) to help for CHNA. Work together as an Aultman system and use the same vendor.

		Meeting with KSU CPH and use them as well? No final answer yet. LHDs: Previously worked with hospitals with the same vendor. We may all be doing this separately but still working together. Meeting the needs for accreditation. Continuing with CMOR. If people want certain data collected or something specific, reach out to Kay. FQHCs are also required to do a CHA. CCMMC is looking to ask a question about whether they are seeing a trend or difference in the numbers every 3 years. We should be asking the same questions every 3 years to see if there actually is a difference so it is easier to track. Is it ODH that requires LHDs to do a CHA every 3 years? PHABs requirement is once during the 5-year accreditation cycle. Are we getting survey burnout? Are we able to stagger the CHA?

Many populations that need to be reach and meeting with many stakeholders. Kay held a meeting with a variety of marketing professionals about building a toolkit for a campaign. Starting talking to marketing vendors to get some potential costs, one is a marketer and professor in marketing and communications, provided an affordable cost. Getting closer about where to go from here. Next step is looking for funding. We have a lot of people who to be putting out our message, just need to get the message made. Mental health in youth is still an important topic, might be one to consider keeping in the next cycle. A lot of

Behavioral Health Supports for School Staff: Kay and Patti report out for the committee. 4 different schools participating as a pilot survey - Patrick Elementary, Canton Local, Minerva, and Osnaburg. Patti and Kay have reviewed the results with the superintendents. Trying to identify what we can include that is missing from the schools or what is the most important thing we can add. How can we generate funding for these schools to add what they need. What to help build off of what the schools have started. Reevaluate in the future to see if it is helping. A lot of the educators did not know where to find resources the help them, how can we really get that information out to them? Aultman Ambassadors that are in the schools? Formalized partnerships between behavioral health providers and medical offices: Amanda Nelson reports out for the committee. Following HIPPA and 42 CFR new guidelines. When working together, the records release is a barrier. Patients can be frustrated when they have to repeat the same information back to different doctors. This will get all agencies on the same page. Moved meetings to bimonthly to meet with agencies one on one. Interviews have been very impactful. Is there a way to get everyone in the room together and share what is offered? Collaboration can exist without the competition. Guaranteed funding for addressing non-treatment barriers for behavioral health access: Cindy reports out for the committee. First, looked for barriers that they saw in their own clients. A survey was given out. The barriers were transportation, food insecurity,

		health literacy, utility cost, and housing. CMOR will compile the results and put together a report. Big complaint of the survey is how long the survey is. Keep extending the deadline for the surveys. Last time Kay checked with CMOR, we were at about 90 surveys so far. Kay is still looking for agencies to give out the survey. SCHD had their translator complete some surveys with our Hispanic clients. Digital platform for SDOH: Anju reports out for the committee. We are ready to build the network, if we have the funding. Anju has been leading a steering committee with key stakeholders and funders. Showcase at Unite Us in September and a lot of people showed up. Explained how the platform works and the success stories in communities that are using it. Anju has presentations scheduled with foundations that have not been involved in the steering committee. Goal is to start July 1, 2025. Anju shares information she learned at a conference in Washington DC in early December. There might be some changes coming relating to Medicaid, chronic disease (mental health) and some unfunded mandates. There is a lot of uncertainty. This is a chance for us to be innovative. Ohio is below the national average for health, and Stark County is below the Ohio average for health.
