2025 Health Summit Recap- • Evaluation- please complete if you have not done so. • Overall, strengths & opportunities for improvement • Thoughts around skipping a year and reconvening in 2027 (due to cost and time commitment)	Comments about Health Summit: Cindy – line up for the speakers were right on point and the messages were interwoven with each other. Dr. Mader – Thank you to SCHD. The summit keeps getting better and better every year. Food was lackluster this year, hand full of people agreed. Patti – it was nice to have the dining room, lots of good discussions and networking. It is so wonderful for		

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	everyone to be able to see all of the data from the assessment. Dr. Snodgrass – people were really into the tabletop discussions, we are going to get a lot of good information from those surveys. Maybe have a slide up with the questions for the tabletop discussions. Michele H – great to look at the data, but it would have been nice to have a hard copy or have them electronically so people can take their time to look over it. Amanda N – a lot more people stayed after lunching this year, we tend to lose a good chunk after lunch. Dr. Humphrey – it was great to highlight all of the positive outcomes and good things during all of the uncertainty. Tasha – glancing over the summit evaluation, people want more networking opportunities, see how environmental health ties into all of this. People were requesting nursing CEs (process can be difficult), but we can do REHS because you can do it after the fact. Looking towards future summits: Nicole – Could be beneficial to switch up the length of the summit every couple year.	
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	Cindy – enjoys being able to update the community in our changing world, but it could be shorter. Dr. Snodgrass – possibly send out a follow up to attendees about what they think about the how often we should have the summit. Amanda – looking at the tabletop discussion results, people want more of the community conversations (like transportation, housing and food ones). This could be an alternative to the summit for the “off” years. Dr. Powe – would be willing to help get CEs in the future. She suggested to work with OSOPHE, Dr. Snodgrass said she would work with Dr. Powe if we end up doing CEs in the future. Continuing Education is always a topic that gets brought up every year. It can be very difficult to get CEs (a lot of paperwork and we would need the presentations months in advance, tried working with the hospitals All presentations and information from the health summit will be on the health department’s website as soon as Kay is able to get them uploaded.

Next step is focus groups – asked attendees of the summit who the focus groups should be around. Kay is going to set up separate meeting to schedule and plan focus groups with the 4 health departments, but anyone can join. Going to be a quick turnaround. Hospital CHNAs: Aultman CHNA – working directly with squire. Distributed internal assessment to staff and PCP's, making progress. CCMMC CHNA – not much of an update, but in progress! Though the health departments and hospitals are doing different things, we will all be able to benefit from the	
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	different ways and groups that we are getting data from. People are curious to see the data in a few years, with Medicaid is being threatened, the data might be drastically different. Elaine – talking about mental health services and the data, wanting to following up with the people who took the assessment and seeing what they met about lack of mental health services, helping people become aware of the services that are available. People think about private mental health services, people do not think about places like CommQuest, CNA, etc. Patti – following up with Elaine, helping people become aware what is available with different types of insurances (Medicaid, Medicare, private insurance), similar to what the school supports subcommittee did with the teachers.

Did prioritization at health summit, using that data would like to get started on planning and prepping for next cycle. Need to look at what the high need is. If we can stick with the same elements and continue to make progress with	

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	these current strategies, or make updates and continue to work on them. Health departments use clear impact, making sure that what we end of up doing is able to be measured. We will not be able to start working on this in the next 3 months, due to summer and finalizing the CHA results. Just start thinking about what we should do.

Updates were given at the health summit yesterday. Amanda N – planning to continue the one on one conversations with organizations. If your organization has not had one of these conversations yet, reach out to Amanda Nelson. Patti – schools supports is now a well oiled machine, if more schools want to do the survey, it is available. Digital Wellness is kind of just taking off, going to launch campaign. Going to look at OHYES! Data for next school year. Dr. Mader – SIEN is being launched. Moving on to bigger and better things, this will be connected to community conditions (SDOH). Cindy – we had the community conversations, but for the future, do we need to do more or should we start to do the solving piece of the puzzle? All the reports from the community conversations are on the stark county report.
